## YOUTH HOMELESSNESS FUND

The Youth Homelessness Fund is a local network of individual donors and private foundations who are committed to reducing youth homelessness through leadership, education, and collaborative grant making. To date, the fund has granted \$155,851 for the first collaborative planning grants for youth homelessness and to administer YouthCount 2.0, a program that provides the first-ever comprehensive look into youth homelessness in the greater Houston area. In 2018, the YHF will support the implementation of the planning grants made in 2016 and will also explore opportunities to connect homeless youth to local resources through increased social media and communication efforts.
